What is Title I?

The Foundry is identified as a Title I school as part of the Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA). Title I is designed to support State and local school reform efforts tied to the challenging State academic standards to improve teaching and learning for students. Title I programs must be based on effective means of improving student achievement and include strategies to support families. All Title I schools must jointly develop with parents and family members a written parent and family engagement policy.

School Plan for Shared Student Achievement

What is it?

This is a plan that describes how The Foundry will provide opportunities to improve family engagement to support student learning. The Foundry values the contributions and involvement of parents and family members to establish an equal partnership for the common goal of improving student achievement. This plan describes the different ways that The Foundry will support family engagement and how parents can help plan and participate in activities and events to promote student learning at school and at home.

How is it revised?

The Foundry School invited all parents to attend our annual parent and family engagement input meeting last spring to review and revise this parent and family engagement policy, as well as the schoolwide plan, our school-parent compact, and the family engagement budget. Additionally, parent input and comments regarding this plan are welcome during the school year through an online form. The plan is posted on our school website for parents to view and submit feedback throughout the year. All parent feedback received during the year will be used to revise the plan for the next school year. We also distribute an annual survey online and by mail to ask parents for their suggestions on the plan and the use of funds for family engagement. Parent and family members can also give feedback during several parent meetings and activities during the school year.

Who is it for?

All students participating in the Title I, Part A program, and their families are encouraged and invited to fully participate in the opportunities described in this plan. The Foundry will provide full opportunity for the participation of parents and family members with limited English, with disabilities, and of migratory children.

Where is it available?

As a reminder, at the beginning of the year, after revisions we will email through Infinite Campus a plan to all parents in August. The plan will also be posted on the school website and social media. Parents can also retrieve a copy of the plan in the Parent Resource Center.

District Goals 2024-2025

Goal 1: By the end of FY25, the percentage of students in each subgroup moving into the "Proficient" and "Distinguished" levels of performance on the Georgia Milestones Assessments will increase by 2% in the "Proficient" and "Distinguished" levels of performance.

Goal 2: By the end of FY25, Increase the percentage of referred students who access school-based mental health services in order to increase the overall school climate rating for HCSD by 1%.

School Goals 2024-2025

Goal 1: By the end of FY25, at least 75% of high school students enrolled in person at The Foundry will have successfully completed three Direct Taught and/or Edgenuity courses in order to raise the Foundry graduation rate by 5%.

Goal 2: For FY25, 100% of The Foundry middle school will complete their program portfolio, encompassing the H.C.S.D. literacy components in order to increase the English Language Arts, End of Grade scores for 6th, 7th, and 8th grade by a cumulative average of 5%.

Goal 3: For FY25, all Foundry students will actively participate in a daily Social and Emotional Learning program, "Real Time", which will increase the graduation rate by 5%.

Goal 4: For FY25, The Foundry Staff will increase parent and family involvement in school activities by 5%.

School-Parent Compacts

As part of this plan, The Foundry and our families will develop a school-parent compact, which is an agreement that parents, teachers, and students will develop that explains how parents and teachers will work together to make sure all our students reach grade-level standards. The compacts will be reviewed and updated annually based on feedback from parents, students, and teachers during the annual parent and family engagement meeting.

The school-parent compacts also are shared with parents during parent-teacher conferences and kept with each child's teacher if parents need another copy.
